

The Alhambra. That Fannes Clindel to the City of Granuda.

Alhambra is the name given to the fortress which forms a sort of acropolis or citadel to the city of Granuda, in which stood the palace of the ancient Moorish kings of Granuda. The name is a strong wall more than a mile in circuit and studded with towers. The towers on the north wall, which is defended by mature, were used as residences connected with the palace. 


