The Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security was created by an act of the Parliament of Canada in 1984 to increase knowledge and understanding of the issues relating to international peace and security from a Canadian perspective. The Institute is not part of the government decision-making process. It is a Crown Corporation, solely funded by the Parliament. The Board of Directors is appointed by the Government of Canada after consultation with all recognized parties in the House of Commons.
