The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the appointment of Mr. Campbell Moodie as Canadian Consul General in Seattle, to succeed Mr. A.S. Whiteley who is retiring from the public service. At present Counsellor of the Canadian Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York, Mr. Moodie will be taking up his duties in Seattle shortly.

Mr. Moodie was born in Captown, South Africa, on August 30, 1906, and attended McGill University and New York University. He was employed with the Bank of Montreal in New York from 1938-40, was commissioned in the Canadian Army in 1941 and served during the war with the Department of National War Services, London, and with the Wartime Information Board. In 1947, Mr. Moodie was discharged from the Army and joined the Department of External Affairs, serving at the Office of the High Commissioner for Canada in London. He was appointed Counsellor (Press) of the Canadian Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York in 1960.

Mr. Moodie is married.
