The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44:—

By Mr. Ralston:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. How much money was voted for the repairs to Upper Port Latour wharf in 1932.
2. How much has been expended to date.
3. Whether the work is completed.
4. Who the foreman was.
5. What rate of pay per hour was paid to foremen, carpenters, labourers.
6. Who supplied the timber and/or logs used in said repair.
7. The total amount paid for said timber and logs delivered.
8. What size timber and logs were called for in this work.
9. What sizes were supplied.
10. Whether any of the said timbers and/or logs were condemned and rejected by the foreman or engineer on the work as being unfit for use in said repairs.
11. If so, whether they were finally used in said repairs.
12. Whether the department or district engineer has received any complaints from any person or persons as to the quality and size of said timber and/or logs.
13. What kind of wood was called for to be used in this work.
14. What kind was supplied and used.

By Mr. Gardiner:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. Whether Marine and Fisheries Dredges No. 10 and No. 11 were sold.
2. If so, why and when they were sold.
3. Who they were sold to.
4. The price received.
5. Repairs made to these two dredges in each of the three years preceding their sale.
