PROVINCIAL POLITICAL BROADCASTS—CBXT EDMONTON

Question No. 2,237—Mr. Schumacher:

1. During the period February 14 to March 25, 1975, by day and by time, how much coverage in scheduled news broadcasts was given to each provincial political party in Alberta by CBC Station CBXT in Edmonton, Alberta?

2. For the same period, by day and by time, how much coverage in scheduled news broadcasts was given to each Leader of each provincial political party in Alberta by CBC Station CBXT-TV in Edmonton, Alberta?

3. For the same period, by day, what were the (a) names of provincial political candidates (b) times used by them participating in the "Hour Glass" programme on CBC Station CBXT-TV in Edmonton, Alberta?

Hon. James Hugh Faulkner (Secretary of State): I am informed by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation as follows: 1. No daily breakdown is available, but the following are the cumulative totals by week: Feb. 17-23: Progressive Conservative, 4½ minutes; Liberal, 5½ minutes; New Democratic Party, 3 minutes; Social Credit, 9½ minutes; others, 3 minutes. Feb. 24-Mar. 2: Progressive Conservative, 3½ minutes; Liberal, 1½ minutes; New Democratic Party, 4½ minutes; Social Credit, 2½ minutes; others, —. March 3-9: Progressive Conservative, 6 minutes; Liberal, 2½ minutes; New Democratic Party, 4 minutes; Social Credit, 7½ minutes; others, —. March 10-16: Progressive Conservative, 12 minutes; Liberal, 7 minutes; New Demo-

cratic Party, 7 minutes; Social Credit, 6½ minutes; others, 5½ minutes. March 17-23: Progressive Conservative, 13 minutes; Liberal, 7½ minutes; New Democratic Party, 9 minutes; Social Credit, 8 minutes; others, 1 minute. March 24: Progressive Conservative, 4 minutes; Liberal, 30 seconds; New Democratic Party, 2 minutes; Social Credit, 3½ minutes; others, —. March 25: None.

2. No breakdown has been made of coverage given to leaders, but amount of time is included in the totals given in part 1.

3. (a), (b) March 7: Julian Koziak, Progressive Conservative, 55 seconds; Gordon Wright, New Democratic Party, 32 seconds; Arthur Yates, Liberal, 28 seconds. (Only candidates nominated in their riding as of March 7). March 17: Grant Notley, New Democratic Party, 27 seconds; Betty Howrey, Liberal, 27 seconds; Werner Schmidt, Social Credit, 47 seconds. (Four main party leaders were invited). March 19: Gordon Minieley, Progressive Conservative, 2 minutes; Howard Rubin, New Democratic Party, 1 minute. (Subject was sale of T-4 slips, not election). March 21: Vera Lane, Independent-Liberal. (Subject was water-sewer problem in Peace River, not election. Ms. Lane was invited as a leader of citizens' group seeking action. Item was 11:38 minutes in length, much of this consisting of interview with Ms. Lane and another member of the group).
