sport of the Pescarch Committee for the information of the members of the Executive Council.

At the meeting of the Frecutive Council, the report of the Tessarch Committee submitted by Professor Norman MacKenzie, and a supplementary report by Professor Angus, were considered and referred to the Toronto cembers of the Executive Council.

This committee, consisting of Hon. Newton W. Rowell, Colonel C.S. MacInnes, Professor Norman MacKenzie, with Chancellor N.W. Wallace and Professor George Frong of the Toronto group, met on Murch 13th Their recommendations are as follows :

That Frof. Norman MacKenzie of the University of Toronto be asked to continue as the Canadian representative on the International Research Council of the institute of Pacific Relations, and Chairman of the Canadian Research Committee.

That Prof. C.M. grong and Prof. Chester Martin be asked to assist Mr. MacKenzie in organizing, developing and carrying out the research work of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs.

That each of the various Branches be asked to appoint one of their members to the Canadian Research Committee, and that in the meantime the former members of that Committee, Frof. R.A. Mackay of Dalhousie University, Dean P.E. Corbett of Modill, Mr. C.C. Cowan of Ottawa, Dr. Jno. W. McKay of Manitoba University, Mr. L.B. Ring of Regina and Prof. H.F. Angus of Vancouver continue to act as members of the Canadian Research Conmittee.

That the Chairman of the Canadian Research Committee and the Canadian representative on the International Research Council be appointed by the Executive Council at its annual meeting and that he be made a member of this Executive Council.

From the report of the Research Committee it was apparent that there were at least three matters to be dealt with:-

(1) Pacific Affairs.

We were asked to contribute reviews of events in Canada relating to racific questions, and occasional articles on topics of interest, to the periodical "Pacific Affairs". With regard to this, it was recommended that the Chairman of the Research Committee write to the Secretaries of all Branches and ask them to forward any notes or articles that they thought suitable for this purpose to prof. G.M. Trong, 73 Walmer Road, Toronto, who has agreed to be responsible for the co-ordinating and editing of such material.

(2) The preparation of papers for the Conference. From the experience gained at the Mysic Conference it was realized that the Conference papers should be divided into two groups:
