cost of \$50,000 for site, building, and equipment. Results already demonstrate the wisdom of the policy which led to this Forward Movement in educational work.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S FORWARD MOVE-MENT FOR MISSIONS

This is, in many respects, one of the most remarkable movements of recent times, and is commended to the wise and sympathetic guidance of our ministers, and the prayerful sympathy of the whole Church. Already it has turned the attention of thousands of our young people to the great cause of Missions, led them to pray earnestly for the coming of the Kingdom, brought them into sympathetic touch with the work of the General Board, developed an intelligent loyalty to the Church of their choice, and, by the method of weekly givings, is training them in habits of systematic beneficence. Contributions last year from Epworth Leagues aggregated \$18,313.57. This year it is expected they will make a good advance on this amount. On many districts the Leagues have organized for the support, in whole or in part, of a Missionary in the Foreign or Indian field, and the movement is spreading rapidly. Our College Societies are joining with the Leagues, and all are showing a commendable spirit by falling into line with the General Board in its Missionary work.
