IN obedience to the King's Commands, I took the earlift Opportunity, after Potter's Arrival, of writing to Sir Charles Saunders, to Major General Parflow at Gibraltar, and to all His Majeffy's Confuls in Spain, as well as to Mr. Hay, that he might give the fame Notice, to thole who are in Portugal, in order, that every one might put himfelf, and His Majefty's Trading Subjects, properly on their Guard, on account of the critical Situation, in which our Court then ftood with regard to Spain.

I have in vain asked Leave, to dispatch a Messenger for Lisbon, to obtain Passports from the Court of Portugal for myfelf, as was practifed by Sir Benjamin Keene, for his Journey, when he left Madrid in the Year 1739. The Order for Post Horses has been refused me : otherwife, I had prepared the feveral Letters His Majesty had commanded me to write to Commodore Keppel, to Sir Charles Saunders, and Major General Parflow. My Houfe is furrounded with 'pies; I am fo much watched myfelf; and fuch strict Orders are given to stop every one going from Mcdrid; that even if a Perfon would confent to go on this Errand, I. could not truft 'him; yet, I hope, a Method I have caused to be taken will convey the Intelli-BEACE
