

NOTE.

The object of the Marginal Annotations is to present, in brief and useful form, a complete synopsis of the changes in the Statute Law in Ontario since the publication of the Revised Statutes of 1897.

These changes now run in the thousands, and it is to be supposed that few practising lawyers have taken the trouble to connote the R. S. O. with the volume issued each year. The compiler has spared no pains to make these annotations brief and accurate, and cross-references have been used wherever it was thought that they would be useful.

Another feature is the system of references to decided cases. By this means the user of the Marginal Annotations is at once put in touch with all the recent reported cases affecting any particular statute or section.

To use the Marginal Annotations to best advantage, go through the Statutes and make a cross (X) opposite each section referred to in the Annotations, or paste the Annotation in the Statute opposite the appropriate section. An edition on gummed paper is supplied for this purpose.

The Annotations have been completed so as to include 5 O. L. R. and the Statutes for 1903.
