Billings v. Canadian Northern Railway Co.—I. F. Hellmuth, K.C., and D. J. McDougall (Ottawa), for Billings; E. D. Armour, K.C., for the railway company. Appeal by Billings from award of board of arbitrators of Dec. 3, 1913. The award was in respect of certain lands of Billings and other certain lands of Billings for which the railway company tendered Billings \$3915, but for which the arbitrator allowed him \$950. The arbitrator dissenting therefrom and being of opinion that he should be allowed \$3915.
