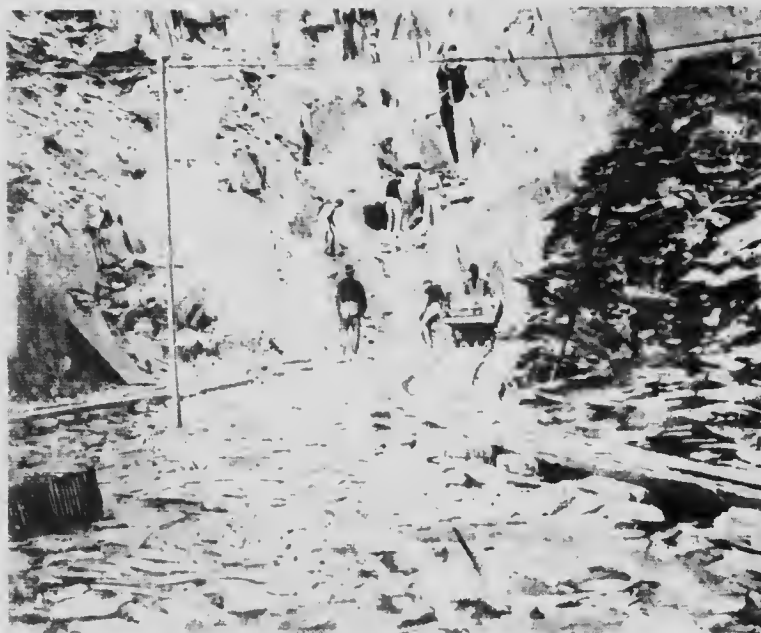


Fine Type of Worker who will Develop Newfoundland Slate Quarries.
