the Western Frontiers of New England and the Province of New York as far as the City of Albany, had experienced most mischievous Effects from this Fort; it ferved the French. as a Place of Rendezvous to fit out Parties from, both of Canadeans and Indians to make Incursions and Depredations upon the adjacent Territories of the English, which they had greatly galled even during that War, burning and deftroying the whole Village of Sarahtoga, and Fort Maffachufets itfelf; and was likewife a Place of Safety for them, upon their Retreat from any of these Enterprizes : It was befides abfolutely necessary to employ. as foon as possible the Indians of the Six Nations, who were much depended upon for their Affistance in this Attempt; as the English had loft their good Opinion and Refpect, together with their former Attachment to their Intereft in nothing more than fuffering the French to build this Fort, fonothing could more retrieve their Influence over them, and all the Indians dependent upon them, than the Reduction of it : The Acquifition therefore of this Fort, in cafe even of the other Parts of the Expedition's being dropped or attended with Misfortune in the Profecution of it, would in a great measure, of itself, recompense the Northern Colonies for their Expence in it.

As therefore the Seafon of the Year was advancing, the Armament from England not arrived at Louisbourg, and an Attempt for the Reduction

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
