220 Each question brought before the Council shall be debated upon in the order in which it was put, excepting special rules of pre-eminence.

236 All motions shall be in writing and seconded before being discussed or put to vote by the Mayor or presiding member. When a motion is seconded it is read in french and in english by the Mayor or presiding member, if he is familiar with both languages if not the motion is read by the Mayor or president in one of the two languages and he shall have it read in the other language by the Secretary Treasurer or Clerk, before the motion is discussed; but no motion asking for an expenditure shall receive effect if no notice thereof has been given at a previous meeting, without the approval of the three fourths of the members present.

240 If any motion is made before the Council for any subsidy, tax, assessment, or charge on the rate payers, the subject shall not be immediately considered but put off to a subsequent meeting.

250 Any motion or report involving the expenditure of any portion of the Municipal revenue can be adopted by the Council unless previously submitted and favorably entertained by the Finance Committee.
