

"After the storm a calm," may be used to describe the situation in wheat as far as speculators are concerned. After the mad buying and wild fluctuations of the past few days the market seems to have become comparatively dull. Little trading was done to-day, and prices generally showed a partial reaction from last week's abnormal advances. At Chicago May wheat declined an extreme 10c per bushel and closed at \$1.65, 14c lower than on Wednesday. July covered a range of about 5 cents, opening at \$1.12½, selling down to \$1.07½ and closing at \$1.08½, 2½c lower than yesterday. The September option, after gaining 1½c, fell to 86½, a loss of 1½c for the day. The December future closed ½c lower than yesterday. Similar losses were chronicled on the other leading United States markets. At Toronto five and ten car load lots of No. 2 red could be had around \$1,10, country farmers on the local market, however, realizing \$1.15 to \$1.17 for extra-anality deli-Thursday Evening, May 12,

According to reports from the far Western States the present indications are that the farms out there will give an increased harvest this year. In the Pacific Northwest the increase in the grain acreage is about 16 per cent, over last, year, and all the crops are in the best condition. Along the line of the "Ontario Rallway & Navigation" the estimate of the grain increase is 15 per cent, over last year's acreage, the increase being made up chiefly of spring sowing induced by the high prices recently existing for wheat. The Northern Pacific reports an increase of about 10 per cent, in the acreage of grain along its lines. In some regions, such as Willamette Valley, the acreage this year is as high as 75 per cent, in excess of last season, Rallway men are greatly pleased over the outlook, as they think it means larger traffic receipts for them the coming season.

The strength in provisions continues. Pork rose another 22c at Chicago to-day, lard another 10c and ribs another 25c.
At Liverpool to-day lard was quoted 2s 3d higher at 33s.
