SLUMP IN GERMAN BONDS.

Berlin Despatch Indicates That the Economic Stability of the Empire is in Danger.

DEBT OVER A BILLION DOLLARS.

Confidence Has Disappeared, and Holders of Bonds Are Selling Indiscriminately.

New York, Dec. 13.—According to a Berlin despatch there has been such a slump in the price of mortgage bonds that, unless public confidence is restored, the economic stability of Germany will be imperilled.

The amount of mortgage bonds in circulation is five milliards of marks (\$1,000,000,000). Mortgage banks were the principal sources of supply to the money market, their bonds being regarded as first-class securities. This confidence has disappeared and the public are selling bonds indiscriminately. The Prussian Bank in one week purchased \$4,000,000 worth of its own bonds. The first Prussianische Hypothek Bank and the Deutsche Grundbesitz Bank are unable to meet the strain, and the Government has appointed receivers in both cases. The papers demand the arrest of Directors Sander and Schmidt.

The Evening Post says: "Banking firms having intimate association with the German financial situation express today no great concern over the statement of Germany's economic stability. While admitting that the situation presents serious aspects, they assert positively that there is no cause for alarm."

TWO PROMINENT MEN GONE.

Death Claims Nicholas Haughan and Thomas Dexter, Both Well-Known Citizens of Toronto.

Toronto was called on yesterday to mourn the loss of two well-known and highly-respected citizens. Mr. Nicholas Haughan and License Inspector Dexter, 51 years of age, came to Canada when he was 7, settling in England with his parents.

The deceased was a successful builder and contractor. From valuator for St. Lawrence Ward, he became in the service of the City Assessment Commission in 1877. He retired in 1887.

In politics he was a Liberal. He was member of the Methodist Church, of the York Pioneers and St. George's Society. He was a valued member. He leaves three sons and two daughters. The funeral will take place tomorrow afternoon at Mount Pleasant.

The Late Thomas Dexter. By the death of Chief License Inspector Dexter, one of the best-known men in Toronto is gone. He was 78 years of age. Born in England, he came to Canada in 1849 and started business as a provision merchant. Twenty-five years ago he was made secretary of the Board of License Commissioners, and in 1888 Chief License Inspector.

He was a member of the Jarvis-street Baptist Church. For years he was associated with the St. George's and Philharmonic Societies. Besides a widow, he leaves two sons and four daughters. The funeral takes place to-morrow morning.

M'OLLIS GETS THREE YEARS.

Montreal Cold Storage Swindler Sentenced Yesterday by Justice Hall.

Montreal, Dec. 13.—(Special)—The Victoria-Montreal Fire Insurance Company has taken out suit before judgment in the hands of H. A. Wilder & Co., Fraser Bros. and the Bank of British North America, against Messrs. Thomas A. Temple & Sons, agents whom the company has a claim for over \$200,000 for monies collected. The petition makes the usual allegations.

M'ollis Gets Three Years. This morning in the Court of Queen's Bench, Justice Hall sentenced Donald J. M'ollis to three years' imprisonment in the penitentiary for his part in the cold storage swindle. The clerk of the court asked M'ollis if he had anything to say. His answer should not be passed on him. "Your Honor, I have nothing to say. The prisoner could hardly get out the short, falling answer."

ABOUT THE CZAR'S HEALTH.

Russian Official at Paris Said Softening of the Brain Followed the Fever.

Paris, Dec. 13.—Prince Galitzin of the Czar's household called on President Loubet yesterday in order to give a precise report of the Czar's condition. The exact words of the interview are not given, but the general report is that the Prince assumed M. Loubet that "His Majesty's condition of health is now only a matter of days."

This statement, however, does not at all agree with the conversation which the Prince had with the Russian Embassy here, in which he gave a pessimistic account of the Czar's condition, reporting that the attack of typhoid fever had been followed by softening of the brain. On some occasions, he added, the Czar failed to recognize those around him.

There is no truth in the Italian rumor that Nicholas II. intends going to St. Petersburg to recuperate his health.
