

WAS GREAT DEMAND FOR BUTCHERS' CATTLE

But General Quality Was Not So Good as in Early Part of Week.

UNION STOCK YARDS

Run on Sheep and Lambs Very Light and Did Not Justify Market.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards yesterday were 54 carloads, 977 cattle, 1252 hogs, 92 sheep, and 200 calves.

Butchers' cattle—The general quality was not so good as in the early week, but the demand was just as good, and the trading was active and steady at the prices quoted for Monday and Tuesday.

Stocks and feeders—Business in this division was quiet as outside a present few low and speculators especially cannot hold them over.

Milkers and springers—The quality of the offerings did not go above fair and prices paid did not exceed \$65.

Calves—About 150 of the receipts were rough calves killed direct thru the market. The balance sold active and firm with \$10.50 for the high price and around \$8 for the low.

Sheep and lambs—The run here was again very light, and a market was hardly established. Prices remained unchanged.

Hogs—Packers made a mid-week raise in quotations, and \$5.50, fed and watered, was generally offered, and some cases were not up to \$5.50 for select.

ACTIVE DEVELOPMENT ON MINING PROPERTIES

Equipment of All Kinds Being Brought Into Gold Camps of North.

NEW MINERAL FOUND

Kerr Lake Company to Develop Sesekinika District—First Real Test.

Munro—Several tons of equipment for the big air compressing plant to be installed at the Munro Mine are now on the way from Matheson. The plant was bought from the Badger Mine in the Cobalt district and will have a capacity of one million cubic feet.

The department of mines is investigating the platinum discovery near here. It is likely that a geologist will be appointed to decide if the proposition will be as profitable as the first assays indicated. It is learned on good authority that the discovery of a new mineral has been made. It is a combination of silver, gold and platinum and other minerals, and its outward appearance is not unlike galena. J. A. Hough, the mining recorder for the Larder Lake district, is in charge of the department of mines for a preliminary report.

Matheson—The Kerr Lake Mining Company, which with Morgan Cartwright of Toronto is associated in purchasing equipment, including a hauler for the development of the claims in Bowman Township, Bowman Township is well known to prospectors and has been successful in developing values in gold, but little development work has been done so far.

Sesekinika—The Canadian Mining Corporation has acquired the Malouf property in Marvonia Township. This property was held under an extended option by Buffalo interests, but owing to some dispute, work was stopped. Another gold camp, the Sesekinika, is being developed by the Canadian Mining Corporation. It is situated on the Smith Lake property, about a mile east of Malouf. The Kerr Lake Mining Company intends to follow one of the east veins and crosscut the Malouf vein at the surface. The vein is about fifteen feet and it is hoped good progress will be made when sinking by the Kerr Lake Mining Company. The Kerr Lake Mining Company will be the first real test of the Sesekinika.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. The sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (subject to certain conditions).
