A new and strenuous campaign for the propagation of the "Made-in-Canada" idea was inaugurated last week at the meeting of the National Executive of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association. It will be a bigger, broader and more businesslike movement than the one of some five years ago, and the association will have it in full charge and bend all its energies to secure success. Even the moving picture machine will be utilized.

Local members stated this morning that the projected movement was the biggest thing the association had taken in hand for a long time. While it was connected indirectly with the similar movement five or six years ago, the association now proposes to handle the entire proposition itself and to operate it primarily as a business and advertising undertaking, wite ditorial assistance playing a secondary part. The plans upon which they are working include practical encouragement to "Made-in-Canada" exhibitions, the erlistment of the suppert of commercial travellers, including shop-keepers to dress their windows at certain regular times exclusively with Canadian-made goods, the teaching of the "Made-in-Canada" principle in schools by means of object lessons representative of typical Canadian industries, talks to workingmen, moving pictures and a hundred and one other things calculated to help the movement along. The matter has been left in the hands of a sub-committee to elaborate a definite plan of operation, and will be made the subject of a special report at the annual meeting, which is to be held in Hamilton in September.
