AN EXAMPLE FOR ST. JOHN
Halifax Provides Dental and Eye Treatment of Poor Children Attending Public Schools.
Classes For Defectives
At a special meeting of the Halifax school board arrangements were completed for dental and eye treatment for the children of the Halifax public schools whose parents are not financially able to look after such matters themselves. These things put Halifax in line with other progressive cities in reform in connection with the school system.
One of the most important of the matters completed by the board were the arrangements regarding the instruction of the mentally defective. Miss Hutt of Halifax, who has been teaching in the United States, was appointed. The classes will be accommodated at the new Acadian school building.
Arrangements have been made with the dispensary for a dental clinic, the school board providing doctors and instruments.
The following eye specialists have been appointed by the board: Dr. Kirkpatrick, Mathers, Doull and Cunningham. These doctors will look after children whose parents are not in a position to pay for treatment, and whose eyes require immediate assistance. There is a very large proportion of defective eyesight among the poorer school children of Halifax, and also a very great need of dental care.
