

## THE FAILURE OF CONTROL BY GOVERNMENT

Rev. T. Albert Moore writes of British Columbia and Quotes Editorial.

British Columbia repealed its Prohibition Law, and enacted what is called the Moderation Act, which places the control of the sale of intoxicating liquor directly under the Government. Anti-prohibitionists claimed much for this Act, and especially that "bootlegging" would disappear. The province has had a little more than one year's experience. Following is an editorial from the Vancouver World, of November 9, 1922. The World is a strong supporter of the Government which was in power when the Moderation Act was enacted, and which must enforce the act, under the heading "End the Bootleggers' Paradise," the World editorial says:

## SOUNDING AN ALIBI

Good Detectives Can Usually Tell the True from the False.  
(New York Times.)

Not infrequently when a crime has been committed the finger of suspicion is pointed at one or that person. This is particularly true of murder cases in which suspicion is directed against various persons before the real culprit is discovered and brought to justice.

To be suspected of a crime in which you had no part is most unfortunate, yet it is an experience that many persons have undergone. A crime is committed and because you are placed in a bad light by a chain of unfortunate circumstances, you find that the police are taking an unusual interest in your movements. They question and catch you up, grill you and treat you a bit rough, perhaps, and it is quite plain that they regard you as a promising suspect.

If you are innocent of wrongdoing you have nothing to fear, for it is comparatively an easy matter for an innocent man to prove his innocence. If an unkind fate seems to connect you with a piece of villainy that was not of your making, truth and justice must prevail and triumph in the end.

"I recall a murder case," said a detective, "that happened several years ago. Suspicion fell quite naturally upon a certain man who might have had a strong motive for committing the deed. He lived near the scene of the crime, and it was known in the neighborhood that the dead man and he had been at odds with each other for a long time. I went to see the suspect. He frankly admitted that the slain man and he had long been enemies, but he denied most emphatically that he had any knowledge of the murder. He gave me an account of his movements and he could account for every minute of his time until long after the crime had been discovered. I made a careful and painstaking investigation of his alibi, which was supported by responsible witnesses. Although the cards appeared to be stacked against him, his alibi proved that he could not have committed the murder. The latter was tried and convicted, and later made a full confession of his crime.

"In certain times of trouble a good alibi—I mean by that a real alibi—is the best friend that a suspect can have. If a man is innocent of a crime and presents an alibi in order to substantiate his innocence, his alibi is real and convincing. It will stand up under the most severe tests, and the more it is looked into and investigated the more it is strengthened. An innocent man in narrating his movements does so in a straightforward and convincing manner,

## CRUCIFIXES AND KING'S PICTURES ORDERED PUT BACK

(Canadian Press Despatch.)  
Rome, Nov. 22.—The minister of public instruction today ordered the mayors of 4,000 municipalities throughout Italy to have replaced immediately upon the walls of the public schools the crucifixes and portraits of the King which were removed by Socialist and Communist administrations. "Their removal," says the order, "besides being a gross and intolerable violation of the law, offends the preponderant sentiment of the state and the principle of the unity of the nation, which is symbolized in the august person of our sovereign."

## INDUSTRIALLY MAD, SAYS HON. M. W. DOHERTY

Toronto, Nov. 23.—"If it had not been for the war we would by now have been in the throes of the greatest industrial revolution the world has ever known. Such was the statement of Hon. Manning Doherty, Provincial Minister of Agriculture, addressing about 100 young men and women students at Newman Hall. Hon. Mr. Doherty, who was explaining the aims and objects of the agrarian movement in Canada, was in this particular portion of his address seeking to show that the present unrest throughout the world was neither due to the war nor to the activities of agitators, although he admitted both were contributing causes.

In his opinion the cause of today's unrest was what he termed the world's industrial insanity. In the last 25 or 30 years the world had gone industrially mad, he declared. Towns of 10,000 inhabitants had driven blindly to achieve populations of 25,000, while cities of 100,000 had sought similarly to push the number of their inhabitants up to 250, or more through industrial expansion. They had been artificially boomed by public bodies, who labored under the decision that smoking chimneys and great buildings represented prosperity.

Hon. Mr. Doherty contrasted life in the driving web of industrialism of the city with life as it used to be in rural communities. "The city worker today was denied the joy of creation. Standardization had mean, unvarying and unceasing high speed work upon a single unit in some product, and this meant neither mental revolution nor mental paralysis. Centralization of activity in the cities had made for national top-heaviness. The rural life of the country, he said, had been sacrificed to an over-balanced industrialism.
