### TO NORWAY FOR REINDEER FOR BAFFIN'S LAND

A Start Made in Steffansson's Project—Thanks of Dominion Government.

(Special to Times.)
Ottawa, F. D. 22—Within this year it is expected that the project initiated by Vilhjalmur Steffansson to build up a reindeer industry on the southern part of Baffin's Land will have been put on a sound basis for future development. An agent of the company formed has been sent to Norway to purchase reindeer. He is trying to get 1,500 to ship next July and August to Baffin's Land. They will be landed in September. The market possibilities will be tested out only in ten years, when the herd is sufficiently numerous.

Mr. Stefansson believes that the discovery of oil in the north gives a new importance to his proposals. If reindeer and similar industries could be started in the neighborhood of the oil fields or any rich mining regions discovered, the reduction in the cost of living consequent on having a near supply of food available would make development easier.

On three expeditions he has spent eleven years exploring the northern part of the Canadian mainland and the islands and seas to the north and northwest.
