

ST. JOHN VIA MCGIVNEY JUNCTION

Hon. Mr. Carvell Will Urge Short Route for Transcontinental Traffic—Harbor Commission Plans

Hon. F. B. Carvell, minister of public works, was in the city Saturday afternoon en route to Woodstock. He was met at the station by Stanley E. Elkin, M. P. Hon. Mr. Carvell said the government is

ready to take over the St. John and that satisfactory arrangements would undoubtedly be arranged satisfactory to all concerned. Mr. Carvell spoke strongly of the increased traffic that must come to this port over the railroads under government control. He pointed out that when a train is at McGivney it is only twenty-two miles farther away from St. John than Moncton. Therefore, he said, the

road from McGivney to Fredericton must be put in condition to handle heavy trains to advantage. The Valley railway from Fredericton to St. John will be ready next summer and St. John will then have a short connection with the Transcontinental. The advantageous location of this port for export and import traffic, Mr. Carvell said, had never been properly recognized by the government railways. The through trains, like the Ocean Limited, will go over the Transcontinental next spring, and the minister said

St. John would have trains making the connections at McGivney for mails and passengers. The minister was very outspoken with respect to St. John's rights to better treatment from the government lines. He regards a proper McGivney connection as the most important step in giving St. John the traffic which it should have because of the short haul its position affords, and he made it known that he would press vigorously for all necessary improvements of the line from McGivney to Fredericton. When asked about the report that ships

with Canadian invalid soldiers are to go to Portland Mr. Carvell said it was exceedingly improbable that Portland would be used for that purpose.

Mr. Carvell, during the afternoon, inspected the Y. W. C. A. quarters that are being fitted up in the Sears building and expressed satisfaction with the fine arrangements there being made to look after the wives of returning soldiers landing here and to carry on the sterling work of the Y. W. C. A. He believes the federal government should assist this organization and will so recommend.
