CUNARD BUSINESS WELL ' DEVELOPED DURING WAR

London, May 2—(British Wireless Service)—The development of the Cunard Steamship Company was shown to have been "very encouraging and entirely satisfactory," during the war, in reports submitted at the annual meeting of the company held yesterday.

It was pointed out that on December 31, 1909, the vessels belonging to the company had a total capacity of 275-000 tons and that the company now either holds or controls more than 1-1000,000 tons and has 500,000 tons of shipping under construction for various companies.


