V.C. For Canadian Boy Hero of The Clouds

Lieut. A. A. McLeod Only Eighteen Years Old;
The Great Honor Also Won
By Lt. A. Gerrard

London, May 1.—The Victoria Cross has been awarded to Lieutenants Allan Gerrard and Allan Arnett McLeod, an eighteen year old Canadian from Manitoba, a member of the Royal Air Force, for deeds which stand out, even among the exploits in this branch of the service.

Gerrard, when on an offensive patrol with two other officers, attacked five enemy airplanes, shooting one down in flames. He then attacked an enemy airplane, engaged single handed some nineteen machines, which either were landing or starting off, and crashed one of them against the ground. A large number of machines then attacked Gerrard, but seeing one of his companions in difficulty, he went to his assistance, and destroyed a third enemy machine. Fresh enemy machines were arising from the ground, and he attacked them one after another and retreated only when ordered to do so. Five machines pursued him, but he turned, although apparently

BELIEVES THE CHARGES UNTRUE AND MALICIOUS

Mr. Robichaud, M.P.P., on Hon.
B. F. Smith's Statements

A LETTER OF INTEREST

Hon. P. J. Veniot Has Taken
Steps to Hold Full Investigation;
People Who Made Charges
Must Come to Front

Fredericton, N. B., May 1.—A very interesting communication arising out of an incident in the final hours of the legislative session was received today by the Honourable P. J. Veniot, minister of public works, from one of his colleagues in the County of Gloucester, John G. Robichaud.

It will be remembered that in the last hour's session of the Public Accounts Committee, one of the opposition members, B. Frank Smith, made charges of a general character against two of the road supervisors in the County of Gloucester. The Minister of Public Works was called to the committee room and he, asked Mr. Smith then and there for the name of his informant, which Mr. Smith refused to give, and finally agreed with the rest of the committee that the charges were unsupported and they were

so referred to in the report of the Public Accounts Committee.

The minister of public works, however, told the committee at that time, in his usual energetic fashion, that while he had the utmost confidence in the integrity of his superiors, Messrs. Hebert and McNally, he proposed to investigate the allegations at the earliest possible moment, and as soon as he arrived in Bathurst, he communicated with his colleague in Shippeagan, John G. Robichaud, giving him a statement of the charges of B. F. Smith as outlined in the opposition press, and asking for a report. This came today in the shape of a telegram from Mr. Robichaud which reads as follows:

"Shippeagan, N. B., April 30th, via Bathurst, N. B., May 1, 1918.
Hon. P. J. Veniot, Fredericton, N. B.: Your letter received. In so far as I can see, charges laid against Superiors Hebert and McNally, as outlined in your letter are absolutely untrue and malicious in character. You must insist upon getting name of informant and proceed immediately with most rigid investigation. Matter cannot remain in public doubt for any length of time. Offender, if any, must be punished."

As is natural, the minister of public works is very much pleased over the report of Mr. Robichaud and says that it is nothing more than he expected. He has taken steps, however, towards holding an investigation and proposes that if there is any possible way of doing it, the people who are behind the false statement made, shall be forced to come to the front.
