

GET CHEAP POWER

Kingston, Ont., May 13—Hon. Adam Beck, chairman of the Hydro-Electric Commission, in addressing a public meeting in the city hall on the question of cheap power, stated that the contract the commission had just made with the New York and Ontario Power Company, was at a lower rate than that for Niagara power. Owing to the fact that the Ontario Government could not build apparatus outside of the province, it is necessary to have the company at Waddington, N. Y., reduce the power to the nécessary voltage. The company's figure for a minimum of 2,000 horse-power is \$11.

The prices for power supplied to Kingston would be materially lower than those estimated a month ago. Including all charges the estimates are: For 1,200 horse-power, \$38.83: for 1,800 horse-power, \$22.91.

Mr. Beck ventured to say that in five years Kingston would be able to sell power to manufacturers at \$25 a horse-power.

Assistant Engineer Yates, of the Commission, who is now here, has estimated that Kingston's power requirements are 4,100 horse-power.


