1. That permission is hereby given to the Quarterly Meeting of Walpole Station, and the Trustees of Lot fifteen, Main-street, in the Village of Walpole, to sell said lot, the proceeds to be devoted to Church extension on the Walpole Station.

2. That the Bradford Station Quarterly Meeting have permission to sell Hope Church on that Station.
