

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON OUTDOOR RELIEF AND VISITATION.

The number of families relieved from April last has been 1,900. Men, 1,318; women, 1,837, and 4,228 children, averaging four per family. Total, 7,382. Casuals, 1,074, 8,457; which makes a reduction of over 219 as compared with last year.

¹ Bread Depôts. There were two in the west part of the city, one in the north and one in the east of the city.

Number of loaves distributed 43,533, costing \$3,713.62; a reduction over last year of \$841.

Groceries, lbs. 7,266. A reduction as compared with last year of \$320.

One Conference of Visitors was held with good results.

We cannot close without a word for our Visitors. Most thorough service has been rendered by these gentlemen. Much time has been devoted to the various families. Whilst some good men have resigned, their places have been filled with most careful and earnest men. Nothing but praise is due to these visitors for the devotion they have shewn to the poor and the care they have taken to give only to the deserving and thus save the funds of the House. There are forty-six districts in all.
