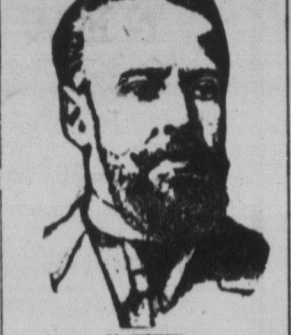

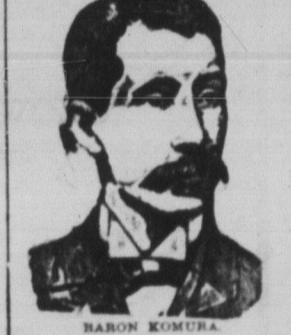

PARTY GOVERNMENT

Hon. F. W. G. Haultain States His Position on the Subject. HE OPPOSES PARTY LINES. He Argues That Non-Partisan Government is Best for the Western Country.

Winnipeg, Aug. 10.—Hon. F. W. G. Haultain has addressed a letter to the press of western Canada, defining at length his position, and stating the reason why he is opposed to the introduction of party government in the Territories.

To divide on Federal lines, he contends is undesirable, unimpracticable and unnecessary as the work of the two Houses is entirely different. The acceptable working of the present system he thinks is proven by fourteen years' experience.

Mr. Haultain believes the work of organizing the new government will be simple without having the additional work of party antagonism. He says that the most important thing is to secure the consent of the people.
