BOARD OF HEALTH.

New Regulations Proposed by the

Board of Health of St. John City.

ST. JOHN, N. B., Aug. 8.-The Board of

Health of St. John City, Portland and

the county of St. John are

consolidated under the name of the

Board of Health of St. John City and

county.

Under the new regulations to be

passed, no person shall be allowed to

bury a dead body in any city or town

located under, until a permit shall

have been obtained.

Public funerals of persons who have

died of small pox, scarlet fever, dip-

theria, typhus fever, or cholera, are

forbidden, and it is made necessary to

inter the body within 24 hours after

death.

Small children are forbidden to attend

funerals of such persons, and it is

made compulsory to disinfect the body

immediately after death and place it in

a coffin or other tight receptacle. The

body shall not be taken to any church

nor shall be covered from the place of

death to the cemetery.

It is also made compulsory upon

trades or other body having in their

charge a public school, church or other

place to provide for the ventilation.

It is also required that placards shall

be placed on the doors of houses where

the inmates are sick with contagious

disease.

Ministers of vessels are required to

report cases of disease on their

vessels and it is made an offence

to remove the dead body of any human

being without a permit. This law

applies to the conductors of trains, masters

of vessels, and others.

When there has been any contagious

disease in a house it is to be disinfected

to the satisfaction of the board of

health, and patients who have suffered

from such disease are forbidden to

associate with the general public until

the sanitary regulations prescribed have

been complied with.

A series of regulations relative to

house drainage and plumbing have also

been provided for and have been

approved by the board.

No cess pools will hereafter be

allowed on streets where there are

sewers.
