The British Columbia Annual Meet at Nanaimo Opens Auspiciously.

Youngsters Make a Brave Showing on the First Day.

Names of Those From Whom the D. R. A. Team Will Be Selected.

(Special to the Times.)

Nanaimo, July 21.—A heavy downpour of rain marred the opening day of the B. C. Rifle Association. Showers descended at frequent intervals throughout the day much to the disappointment of the Nanaimo riflemen, who had taken great pains to insure a pleasant meet, and to the chagrin of the marksmen, who were anxious to make big scores.

Major Bennett, of Vancouver, is range officer and the shooting is proceeding under him with gratifying promptness and dispatch. The executive committee consists of Lieut.-Col. Gregory, of Victoria; George Pittendrigh, of Nanaimo; Lieut. Duff Stuart, of Vancouver, and Corporal Sloan, of the New Westminster.

Dr. Corry, of the U. S. revenue cutter McCulloch, which is coaling at Departure Bay, has attended the matches. His men were invited to participate, but it was found impossible for them to do so.

The tyro match brought honors to Victoria boys, Bomb, Watt, Winsby making a full score of seven bulls-eyes, while A. W. Currie took second place. The following was the score:
