IN THE BROAD STREET IMPROVEMENT MATTER

Chief Justice Gives His Judgment in Favor of Mr. Weston—The Full Text. Judgment was given by the Chief Justice in the Supreme court Tuesday in the action brought by the city against John Weston to recover \$1,400.70 under the Broad Street Local Improvement By-Law. The action was dismissed with costs. The judgment in full follows:

The arithmetic paper was well done. Lockwood is especially worthy of commendation, having obtained 85 per cent., and of the rest only two boys failed to obtain half marks. The algebra papers were also well done. The English papers in Division I were not done so well. Faulds, who was first, only obtaining 45 per cent.; but the school did excellent work. Coulthard obtaining full marks, Pitts 97 per cent., Harrison 90, and nearly all the rest over 75. On the whole, the work has been done very carefully and in good style, and I am sure your staff must be well satisfied with the results.

In VI Form, Dorrell obtained the highest percentage on the whole, 79; Faulds follows with 68, Todd 64. In special subjects, Dorrell has 96 in Divinity; Faulds 81 in Latin, 93 in French, and Todd 1, did excellent work. In the V. Form, Marshall obtained the highest marks on the whole, 78; Lockwood following with 73.

In the Upper IV. Form, Davidson obtained 75 on the whole, and Garnett 72. The highest marks in Latin were: Davidson 91, Garnett 89; in French, Garnett 89, Davidson 87; in Divinity, Garnett 89, Eddie J. Erwin 78.

In III. Form, very good papers were written in special subjects. In Latin, Hill 82, Pinder 62; in French, Todd II, 64; in Divinity, Turner 80, Stoddart 87; geography, Turner 80; English grammar, Todd II, 70.

The English history papers were not up to the average of the other work. In the English essay for the VI., V. and IV. Forms, the highest mark was obtained by Marshall, 85; for a very well arranged and full paper on the "Birds and Wild Animals of the Province"; Maroon, with 84, shows great promise in a paper on the "Vanities of Human Wishes," and Dorrell, with 80, gave an intelligent paper on "Free Trade vs. Protection."

An application was made for a hydrant on the corner of Chambers and Pandora avenue. Referred to fire wardens for report. The finance committee recommended the appropriation of \$1,123.01 for the usual purposes. Adopted. The jewellers' by-law was reconsidered, adopted and finally passed. The by-law solicitor to the city was advanced through committee. The council then adjourned.
