An Interesting Timber Case. We gather from a report in the Timber Trades Journal of 31st ult. the particulars of an important trial that took place in London on 27th and 28th ult. at the High Court of Justice, Chancery division.

The DEBY BRANCH. We have frequently been asked by our readers for the particulars of the Deby Branch, which was a subject of some interest in the Miramichi. It is now in the hands of Messrs. Churchhill & Sim, 29, Clement's Lane, E. C., and the object of it was to declare that the defendants were liable to the plaintiffs for the proceeds of the sale of a certain large quantity of timber, which was originally purchased by the plaintiffs through Messrs. Churchhill & Sim, and which was afterwards sold by that firm as the plaintiffs' agents.

On the 10th May, 1879, Messrs. Churchhill & Sim proposed to purchase from Messrs. Churchhill & Sim, 29, Clement's Lane, E. C., that they should purchase between 11,000 and 12,000 standards of Baltic timber, the value of the same being £70,000.

They professed to be ready to accept the work last fall, as completed so as to justify them in taking it off the contractor's hands, but went squally back on their word.

Their whole course shows that they are entirely insincere and have no immediate intention of departing from their present policy. Every Tom, Dick and Harry who has any business to do with the Government, and so far as the Government or railway people are concerned, they are simply playing with the credulity of those for whom the ADVANCE spoke last week.

On that occasion the shrewd and experienced contractor, who prevented the Northern & Western from crossing the Miramichi to Derby by a bridge and running thence, via Indian-branch, up-river. "Fish Warden Whittier, of Old Orchard, saw last evening three mackerel schooners fishing within the three mile limit. He captured them and sent them back to Portland. The captured vessels were the Dreadnought and James M. Dyer, both of Portland. The other schooner, hailing from Provincetown, escaped. The penalty for fishing within three miles of the shore is \$500 for each schooner and \$100 for each fisherman.
