CHILD'S BODY FOUND.

Case of Probable Infanticide Discovered by Crew of the Curlew, Near Lepreux.

ST. ANDREWS, N. B., June 9.—The body of a fully developed female child, picked up by the crew of the Curlew patrol number two, yesterday off Seel's Cove, between Beaver Harbor and Point Lepreux, was brought here

last evening. It was deposited in undertaker Richey's shop. An inquest is being held today by Coroner Dr. Harry Gove. The child has evidently been improperly dealt with, the umbilical cord was not tied.
