At a meeting of a number of the enthusiasts held in Halifax, it was decided to form a Maritime Association of the clubs in the various provinces for the purpose of increasing the interest taken in tennis by means of matches between different clubs and yearly contests between teams representing Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, the New Brunswick and the Maritime Tennis Association and the officers elected at the meeting were: Mr. Vidito of Halifax, president; Mr. Malcolm McEvilly of St. John, vice-president; Mr. J. H. Lacking of Halifax, secretary.
