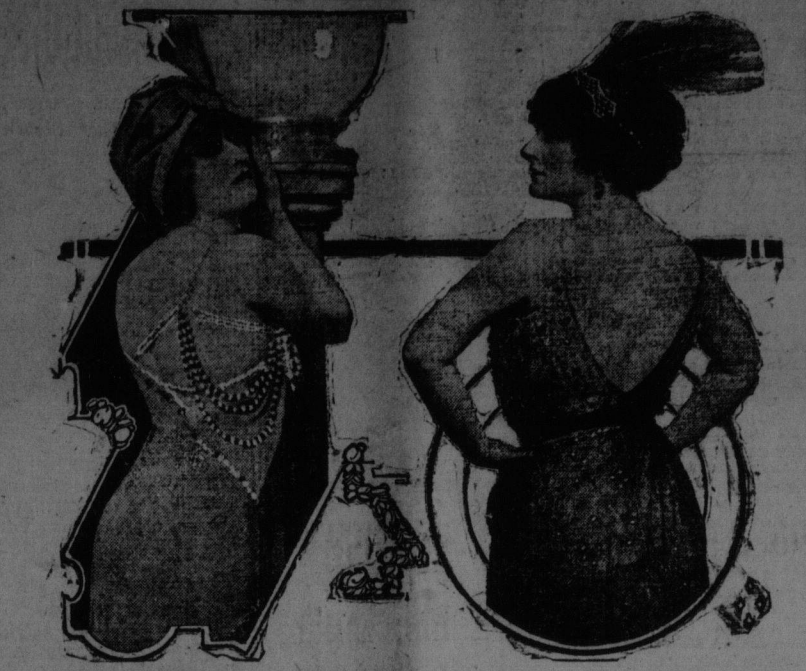

LETTER FROM BOSTON GIRL

Boston, June 9.—Not Solomon in all his glory was ever arrased like one of these. Nor would he and his attendants have drawn stone slingers to the office window. Grey old Boston has for more than two centuries had a liking for scarlet coats and gold braids, but has never been more enthralled than by this year's annual drum head election on the Common, parade, banquet, and other attendant festivities of Boston's ancient and honorable artillery corps. Representatives of the Old Guard of New York, that dies but never surrenders before the most formidable array of bottles and of the veteran corps artillery, long habituated to the diapason of the Hotel Astor cannonade, paraded faultlessly through streets whose zigzag, precisely corrected the effects of their own. A PRESENTATION TO T. B. KIDNER

Superintendent of Manual Training Gets Clock and Address From Teachers Throughout the Province. Fredericton, June 10.—An interesting feature in connection with the closing reception at the Normal School last evening was the reading of an address and the presentation of a beautiful chiming clock to Mr. Kidner, from the Manual Training and Household Science teachers throughout the Province. The address was read on behalf of the teachers by Miss Iva A. Baxter, Chief Instructor of Manual Training in the Normal School, and was as follows:— "Mr. T. B. Kidner: It has fallen to my lot, and I esteem it an honor, to present to you a few words on behalf of the Manual Training and Household Science teachers of the Province of New Brunswick. "It was with the deepest regret that we learned of your decision to accept a tempting offer from one of our Western provinces. "In your capacity as Director of Manual Training, you have discharged your duties in a most faithful and impartial manner. Your experience, knowledge and ability have enabled you to be of material assistance to the various School Boards with which you conferred in regard to Manual Training and Household Science, and not only in School Boards, but to teachers and scholars as well, and we feel that in your departure the province has sustained an irreparable loss. "Our teachers never dreaded your visits, but on the contrary, looked forward to your coming with pleasure, as you were ever ready to give your aid to them. If you sometimes found it necessary to criticize harshly, you never forgot to give praise when praise was due. "Both as Teacher and Inspector you have ever endeavored with a cheerfulness and patience beyond the ordinary to set before us a high standard of work. It was a good technique combined with beauty and truth. "As a small token of our esteem and regard we ask you to accept this gift. As it chimes the passing hours, we hope it will remind you of your friends in old New Brunswick, who most sincerely wishes for health, happiness and prosperity for you and your family to your new home. "The presentation came entirely as a surprise to Mr. Kidner, who spoke feelingly of the very happy relations existing between himself and the teachers, and said that from his arrival in New Brunswick he had received nothing but the greatest kindness and most loyal support from them. Their beautiful present would be treasured by him and would always remind him of the pleasant days in this province, which he had enjoyed. "Mr. Kidner was also presented with a gold signet ring by the faculty of the Normal School. "Mrs. Dougan and Travis are visiting in St. John this week.
