

THREE NEW SEATS WON BY TORIES

In common with all the other provinces of the Dominion, New Brunswick, yesterday did its share toward the overthrow of the Laurier administration. In this province, where formerly only two seats were held by the Conservative party, the balloting resulted in a gain of three other seats, the totals now standing five Conservatives and eight Liberals.

The former members, Dr. the V. Daniel of St. John and O. S. Crockett of Fredericton were re-elected. In addition to these there were captured from the Liberals King, somewhat where Mr. Fowler was elected by a very large majority over Dr. McAllister in spite of a disgraceful campaign on the part of the Liberal workers; Charlotte county, where Mr. Hartt put up a magnificent fight against heavy odds and succeeded in winning out from Mr. Todd who had formerly been considered invulnerable; and Kent county, where Mr. Robidoux, a new man in the political arena, scored a most brilliant victory from Mr. Legere.

It was impossible last evening to obtain the exact returns from a number of the outlying districts and there is a strong probability that when these returns are received the apparent results will be somewhat changed. Mr. Pugsley himself faces almost sure defeat as a result of a recount which will doubtless be demanded because of irregularities in the conduct of a number of the polls. Mr. Carvell in Carleton is credited with a majority of 25 in the minds of Mr. Smith's supporters these figures are not correct and they, making emphatic claims to the seat, have apparently every reason to believe that a review of the ballots will decide the constituency in favor of Mr. Smith.

There is no question that in Sunbury-Queens the tactics of Col. McLean's supporters will be called in question and certainly there appears good reason to believe that the present distributor will be called upon to answer for the deeds of his friends. That this calling to account will result in an even majority of Liberal put up a gallant fight against great odds and while he was unable to win out, he is certainly deserving of all credit for the excellent show he made. The same is true of Mr. Burns, who in the county of Gloucester, found the task of overcoming an adverse majority of 600 a little too much for him.

In Northumberland county Mr. Loggie's former majority of almost 1000 was reduced to something in the vicinity of 400. This, it must be admitted, was rather a disappointment to Conservative workers, who looked for an even larger measure of success. The manipulation in Restigouche county, by which Mr. Murray was put out of the way and the field left clear for Mr. Reid no doubt brought about the latter's election, and the defeat of Mr. Montgomery, who, however, put up a most creditable campaign.

In Westmorland, Mr. Emmerson had the fight of his life. His tremendous influence in Moncton city and parish is apparently lost, for his majority, in what he has been pleased to regard as a pocket borough, has been so reduced as to be almost unrecognizable. There is a strong belief that a review of the ballots in Westmorland will result in Mr. Siddall's election, but for the present that seat is placed in the Liberal column. Mr. Crockett, in York county carried the largest majority on the Conservative side.

Prince Edward Island. In Prince Edward Island the situation formerly stood three Liberals to one Conservative, the latter being Mr. Fraser, of Kings county. As the result of yesterday's contest, Mr. Fraser, who was regarded as a safe man in both districts of Queens county Conservative members, Messrs McLean and Nicholson were elected in Prince county Mr. Richards, a wealthy resident of Bedford was the successful candidate. The parties now stand two each, which is a net gain of one by the Conservatives. The announcement of Mark Hamblin's return to St. John on October 10th next, has aroused the greatest interest.
