IRREGULARITY MARKS THE DAY

New York, N. Y., June 27.—Aside from the political situation, today's happenings were viewed with complacency.

Fears of a money flurry here in connection with July 1st payments proposed by the French government.

The Bank of France lost only a nominal amount of its gold, but increased its liabilities by over \$200,000,000.

Irregularity dominated the stock market throughout. There were brief periods of activity and strength.

Twenty-six years ago today the first transcontinental train of the C. P. R. left Dalhousie station for the Pacific coast.
