

PRELIMINARY WURK LEGISLATION FINISHED


Views of President Wilson and of Democratic Party Platform have been Followed in Drafting Bills.

Assessment Act, 1909."
"Sec. 32. The Assessors shall ascertain, as nearly as possible, the partiulars of the real estate, the personal property, and the income of any person, who has not brought in a statement in accordance with their notice and as required by this law, and shall make an estimate thereof at the true value and amount, to the best of their information and belief; and such estimate shall be conclusive upon all persons who have not filed their statements in due time, unless they can show a reasonable excusa for the omission."
