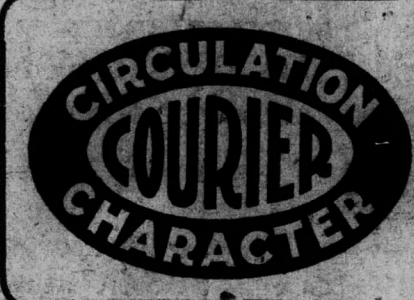

JEWISH WOMEN ORGANIZE FOR RELIEF WORK

Branch of "Hadassah," For Relief in Palestine, Formed

Temporary organization of a local branch of the "Hadassah," a Jewish women's organization to provide medical relief for stricken Palestine, was effected yesterday as the result of the visit to the city of Mrs. Joseph Selick of Toronto. The Hadassah is a non-political organization, its membership comprised of women, and identified with the Zionist movement for the purpose of procuring and transporting medical supplies, and providing institutions, nurses and doctors for the relief of the Hebrews of Palestine. Brantford is the fourth city in Canada in which the Hadassah has been organized, and already flourishing branches are established in Toronto, Hamilton and Windsor.

It was as a result of Miss Kaplan's report that American Jews decided to organize and forward a medical unit to Palestine, and no delay was permitted in conducting the preliminary measures. The women of the United States and Canada have rallied magnificently to this desperate cause, and across the border there are now forty chapters, resembling in organization, the Daughters of the Empire. In the Dominion there are now four chapters, officially organized, Brantford being the fourth, while many cities and towns are taking up the movement. Toronto has the largest chapter in Canada, with a membership of 180. There are 150 Zionist branches in Canada where the movement has gained great impetus, and the Hadassah is closely identified with that movement, its growth is also assured, so Mrs. Selick confidently anticipates. As the result of the enthusiastic meeting held yesterday afternoon at which Mrs. Selick delivered a comprehensive and capable address, a temporary organization was effected with the temporary officers, Mrs. L. Lazarus, President; Miss Shear, Secretary; Mrs. S. Rich, Treasurer.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of one of the British dominions, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years. In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent and holding the same for one year. Pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions. A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, the Homestead, may obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions. Settlers of entries may count time of employment as farm laborers in Canada during 1912, as residence duties under certain conditions. When Dominion Lands are advertised for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entries at Agents Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent. Deputy Minister of the Interior. N.B.—Partnership of the land advertisement will not be paid for.
