HARTY, Hon. WILLIAM (Kingston).

S. of the late John Harty, merchant in Peterborough. B. in the Tp. of Biddulph, 8 March, 1847; removed to Peterborough in 1853. Ed. at Regiopolis Coll., Kingston. M., 4 Oct., 1870, Mary Bermingham; she d. 1889. Was principal of the firm of James Harty & Co., wholesale grocers, Kingston, until his retirement in 1878. Re-organized the Canada Locomotive & Engine Co. in 1881, and was its Managing Dir. until 1888, when he disposed of his interest. In March, 1890, became General Manager for Ontario of the Equitable Life Assur. Co., resigned Jan., 1892, to enter political life. Was a mem. of the Kingston Iown Council for several years; Presdt. of the Board of Trade 1873 and 1874; and Presdt. of the Reform Assoc. in 1879-80. First returned to Leg. Assem. at by-election held 23 Feb., 1892. The election was voided, and at a by-election subsequently held, he was an unsuccessful candidate. This election was also voided, but at the by-election held 8 Oct., 1895, he was returned by acclamation. Sworn of the Executive Council, and apptd. Minister of Public Works, Jan., 1895. HAYCOCK, JOSEPH LONGFORD (Frontenac).

S. of Frederick Haycock who came to Can. from Eng. in 1837. B. in the Co. of Lennox, Ont., in 1850. Ed. in the Common School, and at the New Hamburg Grammar School. Is a market gardener and an auctioneer. Was three years Deputy Reeve, and seven years Reeve of Kingston Tp., and has been Presdt. of the Frontenac Agric. Assoc. Is the Leader of the Patron party in the Leg. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1894. A Patron.—Cataraqui.

HISCOTT, JAMES (Lincoln).

S. of the late Richard Hiscott, of H. M. 76th Regt. R. in the Town of Niagara, 21 Jan., 1826. M., 1846, Hannah M. Reed. Is a farmer. Has been Reeve of the Tp. of Niagara for eleven years, and was Warden of Co. of Lincoln
