BILL.

An Act to incorporate *The College of Bytown.*

WHEREAS His Lordship, Joseph Eugène, Roman Catholic Bishop of Bytown, hath by his Petition to the Legislature represented that a College hath been established at Bytown for the education of youth, and hath prayed that corporate powers be conferred on the said College, and in consideration of the great advantages to be derived from the said Institution, it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petition; Be it therefore enacted, &c.

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said College, which shall be composed of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Bytown as President thereof, the Superior of the said College, the Curé of the Parish of Bytown, the Director of the said College, the Professors of Philosophy and *Belles Lettres* and the Bursar of the said College, together with all such other necessary officers as may be hereafter appointed under the provisions of this Act, and their several and respective successors,—shall be and is hereby constituted a body politic and corporate in deed and in name, by and under the name of *The College of Bytown*, and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power, from time to time, to alter, renew, or change such common seal at their pleasure, and shall, by the same name, from time to time and at all times hereafter, be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy, and to have, take, and receive, to them and their successors, to and for the uses and purposes of the said Corporation,
