IMASCO SCHOLARSHIP FUND FOR DISABLED STUDENTS

PURPOSE:

To encourage young Canadian disabled students to pursue university studies with the ultimate objective of obtaining a university degree.

FIELD OF STUDY:

Undergraduate programme in any field of study.

VALUE:

Each scholarship is valued at \$2,000 annually.

NUMBER:

Minimum 5.

DURATION:

One academic year - may be renewable upon application.

CONDITIONS:

Candidates must be disabled according to the following 1975 United Nations Declaration: A disabled person is "any person unable to ensure himself or herself wholly or partly the necessities of a normal individual and/or social life, as a result of a deficiency, either congenital or not, in his or her physical or mental capabilities". Candidates must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents who have lived in Canada for at least two years as permanent residents. Candidates must be entering or currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree program in a Canadian post-secondary institution which is recognized by the Association of Universities & Colleges of Canada.
