In reply to your letter of the 15 Feb^y I am to acquaint you that the Lieutenant Govt approves of your making the requisition you mention an Account of the Land payments. With respect to the purchase of the Lot A. 11 in the 3^d Concession of Southern Ojibwa, on which is a good Mill seat; I have to request that you will yourself ascertain if the acquisition of it would be of important benefit to Yellowhead's Tribe, with reference to their improved mode of life; as the Lieut. Governor, in that case, will be disposed to effect, if practicable, an exchange of Crown Lands with the Canada Company for the Lot, and bestow it gratuitously on the Indians. I have &c
