

REMEMBER ROSS HE IS PULLING DOWN ONTARIO

Province is Aroused and Puts Up a Fight in Every Riding.

Nominations Day Indications Are That the Head of the Ross Government Will Propose the Budget on Jan. 25—Two Ministers Fail to Attend the Nominations Meetings and Share Giving Account of Their Stewardship—Enthusiasm for Conservative Cause and Coldness for Ross All Along the Line.

Toronto, Jan. 19.—Not a single proclamation throughout the province in the record of yesterday—nominations day. One protest against the Liberal candidate in Thunder Bay and Henry River is entered. Mr. Cameron is protested on the ground that he is not a resident of the province. This will be pushed to the finish. Several old Liberals have got into the fray. Dr. Stark in Stormont set out against the Ross Government and the straight Liberal candidate. In Prescott LaBrosse still stands this ground against Evanturel, and one Conservative is in the field; and there are others. Enthusiasm for the Conservative candidates and coldness for the Ross regime were the outstanding points all along the line yesterday.

Surprise is expressed that Hon. John Dryden did not attend the nomination meeting at Whitby to discuss the issues of the campaign with the electors. The true explanation is that Mr. Dryden is having the fight of his life and fears the judgment of the people. Hon. Mr. Gibson is still in the hands of his physician and did not attend the gathering at Ferris, where it had got noised abroad much opposition would have appeared to his candidacy. He is lying low. Premier Ross appeared at Mount Brydges and posed as a puritan in his usual manner. Charges of corruption and mismanagement were hurled at him. He declared he had no guilty knowledge.

Hon. Mr. Graham, at Brockville, met a storm of dissent when he declared that Rev. Mr. Hossack was a disappointed seeker for a Senatorship. The statement has been denied and it is declared Mr. Graham repeated it under great nervous stress. J. P. Whitney received an enthusiastic reception at Winchester in Dundas County, that augurs well for his success in his own riding. At London Adam Beck, the Conservative candidate, was called a liar by ex-Ald. Farnell, but promptly exacted an apology. This was the single unsmooth scene of the day.

The Ross Government is doomed to drop its head in the bucket on Jan. 25.
