

the egg market. Quotations are: Selects, 2c to 2 1/2c; No. 1 grade, cold storage, 15c; fresh eggs, 25c to 35c.

Dressed poultry is a scarce commodity and quotations are steady. Wholesale dealers quote: live chickens, 12c to 13c; fresh, 10c to 12c; ducks, 15c to 24c; geese, 50c to 10c; live turkeys, 15c to 17c; dressed poultry, 2c to 3c; heavier excooped dressed turkeys at 25c to 35c.

POTATOES AND BEANS

Receipts of potatoes continue liberal and quotations at the same levels that prevailed for some weeks. New Brunswick's are quoted at 25c out of store and 80c in car lots. Ontario potatoes go at 75c to 80c. At Montreal the market is well supplied, French Mountains being purchased at 70c on track, with some extra choice stock at 72-75c to 75c. Beans are quoted at \$2.50 for primes and \$2.60 for hand picked. At Montreal three-pound pickers are \$2.35; eight-pound pickers, \$2.15.

DAIRY PRODUCE

There is little of note in connection with the butter trade. The creamery make is increasing slightly as is also the amount of butter made on the farms. New Zealand butter is sold on the market and its high quality places it right at the top of quotations. Wholesale prices are: Dairy prints, 25c to 27c; creamery prints, 25c to 27c; solids, 25c to 27c; inferior, 25c to 27c; choice dairy butter retail at 30c to 35c. Cheese quotations are: Twines, 14c to 15c; large, 14c to 15c; old cheese, twines, 15c to 15 1/2c; large, 15c.

LIVE STOCK

Receipts of cattle this week have been rather light and of fair to medium quality. Price generally are at a high level, although there are few changes from last week. Extra choice animals brought an average top figure of \$7, with corresponding firm prices all the way down. An average of quotations would be about as follows: Export cattle, \$6.75 to \$7; medium, \$5 to \$6.50; butchers' cattle, \$4 choice, \$5.25 to \$5.50; common to good, \$4 to \$5.25; choice cows, \$5 to \$5.75; common to good, \$2.50 to \$3; butchers' bulls, \$3 to \$5.50; feeders, \$3.50 to \$4.50; stockers, \$3.25 to \$5.50 and canners and cutters, \$2.25 to \$4.

There has been a good demand for milk cows, but prices have been low. Good animals can be secured for \$50 to \$60 and the common sort at \$35 to \$40. Springers are \$40 to \$45. Calves go at \$4 to \$10.

A feature of the market has been the very strong demand for mutton products. Lambs go at the new top figure of \$5.50 to \$5.60 a cwt. Light ewes, \$5.25 to \$6; heavy, \$4 to \$4.50; bucks and culs, \$3.50 to \$4.

Hogs have again reached the \$9 mark, packers now quoting \$9.15 to \$9.25, fed and watered on the market. High prices are making them unusually careful as to the quality of the stock, and anything heavier than choice bacon type is at a discount of 50c; f.o.b. quotations are \$8.75 to \$9.25 for light and \$9.25 to \$9.35 for heavy.

MONTREAL HOG MARKET

Montreal, Saturday, Feb. 15.—The market here is firm, as is the level reached last week, and selected lots of live hogs were quoted freely at \$9.40 to \$9.50 a cwt., weighed cars. The market for dressed hogs is firm, fresh killed abattoir stock being quoted at \$12.15 to \$13.50, with country dressed light weights at \$13 to \$13.25.

EXPORT CHEESE TRADE

Montreal, Saturday, Feb. 15.—The market here for cheese is steady, with prices unchanged from those quoted last week. Finest September cheese being quoted at 12 1/2c to 13 1/4c a lb.; but there is very little demand at these prices, and any holder anxious to realize is obliged to cut prices to force a sale. Every week there is a reduction to some extent of the stock held here, some of the shipments consisting of cheese that have been held in store here on English account, with an occasional lot representing a sale from the stock held here unused. The stock in store here is variously estimated at from 50,000 to 75,000 boxes, all of which will have to go forward before the advent of the new season.

The market for butter is much stronger this week, and prices are advanced, especially on lower grades, the supply of which is steadily diminishing. Good winter made being quoted at 25c and late fall made at 30c. Finest early fall made is quoted at 35c, with New Zealand first grade also quoted at 35c.


