By the time this issue of Farm and Dairy is published, some of our women folk at least will be prepared to come out on left, and the closing on waist and front. Six sizes: 32 to 42 inches bust measure.

Dame Fashion evidently has a warm spot in her heart this season for mother's girl as there are many materials that make very pleasing tub dresses now shown in the stores. A model that should please is No. 9807, and blue chambray combined with blue and brown gingham make a splendid combination for this model. It will be noted that the long-waisted dress is still decidedly popular and soft bolts of the same material or silk, satin or velvet is taking the place of the patent leather belts so much worn last summer. Four sizes: 6, 8, 10 and 12 years.

Another dress that has several good style features and is comfortable, graceful and practical is shown in design 9887. The skirt is in three pieces and is shaped over the front to correspond with the waist. Five sizes: 8, 10, 12, 14 and 16 years.

It is hard to select any material for a house dress that looks quite as neat and clean as black and white checked gingham, and design 9886 would make a pleasing model for this material. It would also look well for serviceable wear in gray or blue striped seerucker, with collar, cuffs and facings of contrasting color. Seven sizes: 32 to 44 inches bust measure.

Perhaps you need a gown for best wear that will be suitable for church. Such a dress is illustrated in No. 9806-9808. This might be featured in foulard, figured crepe voile, or any much in vogue this season. Dark grounds with white figures are the leading designs in printed fabrics. When using the figured fabrics, this little trimming is necessary. This illustration calls for two separate patterns, 10c for each. The waist is a pattern is cut in seven sizes: 32 to 44 inches bust measure, and the skirt in six sizes: 22 to 32 inches waist measure.

We have been showing various styles of ladies' aprons recently to cover the dress at most completely, which are especially suitable for morning work. When we wish to appear just a little more dressed up design 9882 is a simple and easily made style to follow. The waist is cut low with square outline and gathered to a belt which holds the skirt, which has serviceable pockets. Three sizes: small, medium and large. It is well to plan to fashion our summer dresses before the busy season sets in, and design 9838 is a simple but attractive design which might be featured in crepe cloth or ratine to advantage.
