Anything approaching a consecutive series of these invaluable journals are rarely if ever for sale in England, and must become more rare and valuable, as time goes past. Indeed their value cannot be reckoned by dollars or pounds, as the information therein concerns the whole world, and cannot be obtained from any other source. These two sets were formerly in the possession of Mr. Alderman Pickett, who was Lord Mayor of London 1789-90, well known for his patriotism in connection with the Strand improvements. PICKETT STREET and its surroundings has recently made way for the magnificent pile of buildings known as the ROYAL COURTS OF JUSTICE.
