A Report from the Surveyor-General to His Excellency, of the Surveys of County Lines, and of cutting out the same under the directions of His Excellency, performed in the year 1824; also,

An Account from the Surveyor-General of the expense incurred for Surveying and Cutting out the Lines of the Counties and Districts of the Province, in pursuance of the Votes of the Legislature, in the years 1821, 1822, 1823 and 1824; and also,

A Sketch of Nova-Scotia, made by the Surveyor-General, whereon is delineated, in coloured Lines, the Surveys made under the Orders of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

A Bill to continue an Act for the better preservation of the Property of the Inhabitants of the Town of Halifax, by providing a sufficient Watch at Night; also,

A Bill to continue an Act for establishing a Bridewell, or House of Correction, for the County of Halifax, also,

A Bill to continue an Act relating to Wills, Legacies and Executors, and for the settlement and distribution of the Estates of Intestates. And the said Bills were severally read a first time.

*Resolved,* That the Bills be read a second time.
