is the sense of this Committee, that provision be made for the payment of the Members of the Assembly, in a separate bill to be brought in for that purpose, that in case of the dissent of either of the other branches of the Legislature thereto, the other provisions of the bill now under the consideration of the Committee, may not thereby be defeated." And upon the question being put, the Committee divided, and it appeared, that

> The Attorney-General, 7 Mr. Chipman, Members for the City Colonel Billopp, and County of Saint Mr. Pagan, and John, Mr. M'George,

> > Were for the Question: --- And that

Major Murray, Members for York County. Mr. Stelle, Mr. Hubbard, For Sunbury. Mr. Vanderburgh, Mr. Dickinson, For Queens. Mr. Speaker, For Westmoreland. Mr. Campbell, For Charlotte. Mr. Hardy, and For Northumberland. Mr. Davidson,

Were against it.

And that it was the opinion of the Committee, that the petition of Jonathan Leavitt, praying a compensation for damages fustained by a road laid out through his land, should be referred to a select Committee to report thereon at the next Sessions.

Which report was accepted, and the faid bill being read, was agreed to as amended, and ordered to be engroffed.

Ordered.—That Major Coffin, Colonel Billopp, and Mr. Pagan, be a Committee to report upon the petition of Jonathan Leavitt, at the next Sessions.

Committee appointed.
