The Great Work Accomplished at Loretto Abbey

The following is taken from a Toronto paper with reference to "Loretto Abbey of which Miss Lucy Hawkins, formerly of Brantford, is a sister:

"Toronto is the home of many interesting and ancient and modern seats of learning but none is more historic more exclusive or more perfectly conducted than Loretto Abbey, one of the most prominent culture spots for girls in all the Dominion. The location Wellington Place, is, or rather was, ideal, but during the nearly half century which has passed into history since the present site was selected, the transformation in that part of the city has been so pronounced that the business and industrial section has almost enveloped the Abbey grounds, consequently the Sisters are seriously considering an early removal to a recently acquired property of one hundred and forty acres, away out on the confines of the city, remote from the whirl, the bustle and the din, and more in keeping with the quiet dignity which is so fitting an accompaniment to the spirit of this somewhat retiring institution. The young ladies who are fortunate enough to be in a position to attend for a few terms, are afforded many advantages which their less favorably situated sisters can scarcely expect to secure, as Loretto furnishes the very choicest instruction in every branch of education essential to the proper upbringing of its students. The Abbey is affiliated with Toronto University, St. Michael's Federated College.

The College Course takes four years of close application and comprises Classics, Moderns, English and History, and General Courses leading to degrees.

The Academic Course—Lower, Middle and Upper School—prepares students for entrance to Normal School, and faculty of education, special course after junior matriculation for academic graduation.

Dressmaking Course.

Preparatory Course—eight grades—the usual elementary subjects. French, sewing, drawing, choral training physical culture and household science.

Music—Violin, piano, harp, guitar, mandolin, and vocal studies. Students are prepared for Conservatory and University and University examinations. Frequent recitals by distinguished artists.

Art—Studios for Applied and Fine Arts.

Commercial Department—A full course.

At present there are nearly three hundred students enrolled, of whom about one half are resident. The accommodation is most complete, and at every point demonstrates that the comfort and health of those entrusted to their care has first consideration with the Sisters. The twenty large class rooms, the thirty music rooms, the dormitories are all particularly bright, airy and cheery. The chapel, the assembly room, the library, the music rooms and the multitude of other apartments are all on a scale which reflects the utmost credit on those who have had the planning of and carrying out the destiny of Loretto. The imposing reception room is one of the most interesting apartments of the Abbey, because within its spacious walls the late King Edward had been entertained when, as a Prince of Wales, he visited Canada in 1861. The residence and present grounds were purchased in 1867 and since then on account of the very great and ever increasing favor in which the institution is held, it has been enlarged to its present capacity. To those who are interested in educational matters, and particularly along the lines laid down by this worthy college, a visit to Loretto will be a pleasure long to be remembered, as the Mother Superior and Sisters are courteous and hospitable in the highest degree."

BRANT DEANERY HELD CONFERENCE

Missionary Work Discussed by Laity and Clergy Yesterday.

On Tuesday the Brant Deanery Chapter and Missionary Conference was held at St. James Church, Paris. It was largely attended by Anglican, laity throughout the county. In the morning at 10, the Rev. Canon D. T. Owen of Hamilton gave a devotional address and at 11:00 the Rev. C. E. Jenkins of Brantford read a paper on "The Apostolic Conception of the Church's Missions" It was a worthy, thoughtful and reasoned resume on missionary life and effort and creditable to the degree.

The afternoon was partly occupied by a discussion on "Missionary Work in the Parish." Rev. R. J. Seton Adamson discussing its educational side, while the Rev. H. C. Light of St. Pauls showed an unusual practical grasp of affairs in dealing with the financial. A prominent layman, Mr. David M. Rose of Toronto read a paper on "Our Missionary Organizations," and reflected very favorably beside his clerical brother, an expression of thoughtful and conscious endeavor towards evangelisation.

In the evening a Missionary banquet for all attending, took place, and two eloquent addresses were delivered by the Rev. C. H. Sherr, M.A. of Takata, Japan, which was filled with interesting reminiscences of life in the Orient and Mr. David M. Rose, the Secretary of the Anglican Laymen's Movement. The gathering was attended by upwards of sixty people.

The evening closed in a public missionary movement, at which over one hundred people were present and many speakers gave their views on the line of church work. Attending the conference were: Rural Dean Saunders, B.A., and Rev. C. H. Light, the Secretary, both of Brantford.
