WON'T HOLD UP THE BIG FIGHT

Santa Fe., N. M., June 25.—There will be no interference with the Johnson-Flynn battle for the world's heavy-weight championship, at Los Vegas on July 4th by Governor McDonald, provided the county and city authorities for suppression of public gambling.
